Policies and Procedures for Report Card Distribution on Friday, December 9, 2022

Dear Families:

Believe it or not, we have reached the end of the first trimester! Since we're closing out this marking period, your child will soon receive his or her first report card. Students in kindergarten through grade eight will receive their child's report card via email on Friday, December 9th. Students in 3K and Pre-K will get paper report cards sent home with their child on Friday, December 9th.

The purpose of this letter is to serve as a reminder that report card meetings are not mandatory because you already met with your child's teacher for progress reports back in October. We will still have conferences, but these will be at the teacher's request and discretion. A teacher may require a meeting for a variety of reasons including but not limited to a student's academic progress, conduct, or social-emotional growth. Any request a teacher makes for a meeting is mandatory.

For students in grades five through eight, it has been customary for teachers to meet with just the homeroom teacher for parent-teacher conferences. Since meetings are now at the teachers' discretion, teachers may request meetings with the parents of students *outside* of their homeroom, if they feel it is necessary.

Parents will be notified of a required meeting in multiple ways. The teacher will make a notation in the comment section of the report card. A letter will go home on Wednesday, December 7th, and an email blast will also be sent on the seventh, too.

There is no set time frame, but we ask that all required parent-teacher conferences occur <u>before</u> the Christmas recess begins. Friday, December 9 is a professional day, so students in kindergarten through grade eight will not be school. Teachers will be participating in meetings throughout the morning and early afternoon, but we will allocate some time later in the day for parent conferences, too. Again, there is no set time for meetings; they will be scheduled between the teacher and the student's family.




