On this day in 1882 A. A. Milne was born. Now, most of you are probably asking... Who's A. A. Milne? While you may not know who he is, you're probably much more familiar with the characters he created... Christopher Robin, Piglet, Eeyore, Owl, Rabbit, Kanga, Roo, and—of course—Winnie the Pooh!

A. A. Milne wrote *Winnie-the-Pooh* in 1926, a collection of short stories following the adventures of a teddy bear, Winnie-the-Pooh, and his friends. Although the stories are nearly a century old, they remain timeless because of their messages of imagination, friendship, and kindness.

In fact, quotes from Milne's characters are now widespread on social media, acting as sources of both inspiration and contemplation for adults. Do a Google search and see the hundreds of excerpts from *Winnie-the-Pooh*. Here's just a small sample...



you don't spell it.
you feel it.

"Sometimes,' said Pooh, 'the smallest things take up the most room in your heart."

"Some people care too much. I think it's called love."

"You can't stay in your corner of the Forest waiting for others to come to you. You have to go to them sometimes."

"The things that make me different are the things that make me."

"If there ever comes a day when we can't be together, keep me in your heart. I'll stay there forever."

"How lucky am I to have something that makes saying goodbye so hard."

Looking through all of these quotes and excerpts, what strikes me most is that these are all taken from children's books. Some of the themes and messages seem pretty profound and philosophical, yet they were not intended for adults but rather young people.




