#### Dear Families:

Yesterday, actress Jane Darwell would have celebrated her 145<sup>th</sup> birthday. Now, you're probably asking yourself who is Jane Darwell. Good question! I wouldn't know Ms. Darwell either had she not appeared in one very popular movie... *Mary Poppins*.

Coaxed out of retirement by Walt Disney himself, Ms. Darwell portrayed the Bird Lady, the elderly woman who sits on the step of the cathedral feeding pigeons. Although her character is not even given a name, she is, perhaps, the most important person in the movie other than maybe Mary Poppins herself.

In the scene when the Banks children see the Bird Lady, the song "Feed the Birds" is played in the background. It was one of Walt Disney's favorite songs. In fact, all he had to do was say "play it," and his staff knew that meant to play "Feed the Birds."

In an interview, Richard Sherman recalled the day he and his brother wrote "Feed the Birds," and presented it to Disney. He said:

"We wrote the song and took it up to Walt's office and played it and sang it for him. He leaned back in his chair, looking out the window, and he said: 'That's it, isn't it? That's what this is all about. This is the metaphor for the whole film."

Without question, "Feed the Birds" is a metaphor, not just for one movie. It's a metaphor for every day of our lives. Listen to the lyrics...

Come feed the little birds,
Show them you care
And you'll be glad if you do
The young ones are hungry
The nests are so bare
All it takes is tuppence from you

In life, you will come across people less fortunate than you...the little birds. How can you show them you care? The song says it only takes tuppence a bag. Tuppence is only two cents, a trivial sum...a worthless amount. Look at what they're buying... a bag of breadcrumbs...an insignificant amount of food. The bird lady isn't selling breadcrumbs to make money. She's doing it to help others. There is no value, no dollar amount, that can be placed on generosity and kindness. In fact, Richard Sherman himself said, "Songs have been written about a myriad of subjects. 'Feed the Birds' is the first song written about the merits of giving charity."

Of course, this is not the first time you've heard this message. Jesus himself, had his own version of "Feed the Birds..." In the Sermon the Mount, Jesus said: Look at the birds in the sky. They do not sew or reap; they gather nothing into barns; yet your heavenly father feeds them. The two messages are certainly intertwined. Jesus says that God the Father provides for birds. But how? It's us.

He relies on *us* to do his work here on Earth. He relies on you and me to feed the birds. Jesus, himself, said, "Whatsoever you do to the least of your brothers and sisters, you do unto me." What he could be saying is, "Feed the birds."



Dear Families:

On Thursday, October 31st, students in 3K through grade two will be allowed to wear costumes. Students in grades three through eight will have a black and orange dress down day.

For those students wearing costumes, please remember...

- No costume masks of any kind.
- Sneakers must be worn with all costumes.
- No costumes that restrict movement or vision or prevent sitting at desks.
- Costumes may not promote violence or have accessories or props that could be used as a weapon.
- No pretend "prop" weapons such as water pistols, knives, or swords.
- Costumes should not include items with sound effects, lights, or other components which would disrupt the classroom learning environment.

For those students dressing down, please remember...

- Appropriate length skirt, shorts or dress no shorter than 3" above the knees
- No torn or tight jeans or pants
- No spaghetti strap tanks, midriffs, tube tops, etc.
- No logo type T-shirts
- No hats (unless specifically designated)
- No loose/baggy pants or shorts
- No make-up or nail polish (including gels/French manicures)
- No hoop earrings or excessive jewelry
- No jeggings, leggings or skinny jeans



Parents will be called to bring a change of clothes for students who do not adhere to these regulations
