Dear Families:

I hope you all had a relaxing and fun mid-winter break! During the time off, we began the season of Lent with Ash Wednesday on February 22^{nd} .

During Lent is customary to "give something up." Normally, people choose their favorite snack or treat, like ice cream, cookies, or potato chips. During his most recent "vlog" Superintendent of Schools Deacon Kevin McCormack discusses this tradition. He says, "Is Jesus that much happier that I didn't have sour cream and onion potato chips? I don't think so, but I do think it's important that I do that discipline, sort of like spiritual exercise...During Lent, God wants us to change how we act, not what we eat." In other words, giving something up isn't a form of punishment, but rather a practice to help us discipline ourselves so we can treat others better.

I found this interesting prayer online that helps to further explain Deacon Mac's message:

Fast from judging others; feast on the Christ indwelling in them. Fast from emphasis on differences; feast on the unity of all life. Fast from apparent darkness; feast on the reality of light. Fast from words that pollute; feast on phrases that purify. Fast from discontent; feast on gratitude. Fast from anger; feast on patience. Fast from pessimism; feast on optimism. Fast from worry; feast on trust. Fast from complaining; feast on appreciation. Fast from negatives; feast on affirmatives. Fast from unrelenting pressures; feast on unceasing prayer. Fast from hostility; feast on nonviolence. Fast from bitterness; feast on forgiveness. Fast from self-concern; feast on compassion for others. Fast from personal anxiety; feast on eternal truth. Fast from discouragement; feast on hope. Fast from facts that depress; feast on truths that uplift. Fast from lethargy; feast on enthusiasm. Fast from suspicion; feast on truth. Fast from thoughts that weaken; feast on promises that inspire. Fast from idle gossip; feast on purposeful silence. Gentle God, during this season of fasting and feasting, gift us with your presence so we can be a gift to others in

Giving up your favorite snack is great for discipline—and it also helps with limiting cavities and improving diets, but more importantly, what are we feasting on? Is it optimism? Trust? Forgiveness? Feasting on these essential qualities are an excellent way to prepare for Lent, and they have far fewer calories than sour cream and onion chips!

Financial Aid/Assistance/Scholarship is Available on a first-come, first-served basis to registered families. Financial Assistance and Scholarships are limited, so please register, and apply early to be considered.

It is strongly advised that those who'd like to apply for Financial Assistance contact Mrs. Lisa Rizzo (Assistant Principal) in our Business Office at (718) 650-3290 or email her at lrizzo@smsonthebay.com for an appointment. She will be happy to walk you through the process.

Financial aid grants are available for REGISTERED and eligible students in kindergarten through grade eight for those who attend a Catholic Academy or Parish School within the Diocese of Brooklyn. Families must meet financial eligibility requirements to be considered.

The application deadline is usually the end of March for families already receiving assistance and the end of April for first-time applicants.

FACTS is a third-party vendor selected by Futures in Education to conduct fair and confidential financial need assessments for families that may need assistance paying tuition.

What is Triple P?

• Triple P is a parenting program, but it does not tell you how to be a parent. It is more like a toolbox of ideas. You choose the strategies you need. You choose the way you want to use them. It is all about making Triple P work for you.

What Does Triple P Do?

- The three P's in 'Triple P' stand for the 'Positive Parenting Program', which means your family life is going to be much more enjoyable.
- Triple P Helps you:
 - · Raise happy, confident kids
 - · Manage misbehavior so everyone in the family enjoys life more
 - Set rules and routines that everyone respects and follows
 - · Encourage behavior you like
 - · Take care of yourself as a parent
 - · Feel confident you're doing the right thing

Who is Triple P For?

 Triple P is for parents or caregivers of children from 0-16 years of age who have concern regarding their child or adolescent's behavior, development, or potential - or simply want to prevent any problem behaviors from occurring.

How is Triple P Delivered?


- Triple P is Delivered as two-hour small group sessions, targeting a specific problem behavior or issue. Each discussion group can be taken as a stand-alone session or as part of a series.
 - Four topics for parents of children 0–12: (Dealing with disobedience; Managing fighting and aggression; Developing good bedtime routines; and Hassle-free shopping with children)
 - Four topics for parents of 12–16-year olds: (Coping with teenagers' emotions; Reducing family conflict; Getting teenagers to cooperate; and Building teenagers' survival skills).
- Triple P can be delivered both in-person and virtually.
