I know it sounds funny, but today's Ring Day reminds me of my first dog.

Let me explain...

The father of one of my friends is a deacon. One of his responsibilities is to prepare couples for marriages. The first step in the process is to interview the man and woman. The first question he always asks is: "Can you name the three rings of marriage?"

The couples usually look at him puzzled. They always get the first two, but they can never figure out the third. It works every time. When they inevitably give up, he tells them the answer: "First, there's the engagement ring. Then there's the wedding ring, and after that comes the suffering. Get it? The suffer-ring.

Did I mention he's a dad, so this is very much a dad joke, and it's meant as a joke, an icebreaker to break the tension these nervous couples are experiencing.

But, now that I think about it, there's some truth to it. I know this Mass is being live-streamed and will forever be accessible on Facebook, so let me say now that I love my wife and am very happily married. However, marriage does involve some suffering.

The wedding ring is not a symbol of the wedding day alone. It's a symbol of the commitment that the man and woman have to each other. It's a reminder of the good times and the bad times. The happiness and the suffering.

The couple's ring is a reminder that their love endures. The good times are easy; it's the turbulent times where their relationship is truly tested.

Think about it this way. When a sports team wins a championship, the players are all given rings. Those rings don't just represent them winning a championship. No... it's a representation of the entire season. It commemorates both the wins and the losses. The good times and, yes, the suffering.

The rings you receive today are not just to remember this moment. They're not meant to memorialize just your graduation or even just your eighth-grade year. They are reminders of your entire careers at Saint Mark Catholic Academy. When you wear these rings, let them serve as a reminder of the good times you've had, but don't forget the struggles. Remember the suffering.

So, I bet you're wondering what any of this has to do with my first dog.

When I was in first grade, I pestered my parents for a dog, and they finally relented. Jessie was a Doberman-Shepherd mix puppy. She drove me crazy. She had tiny little teeth and she loved to nip at me, especially my socks. Along with biting, she loved eating... and not just dog food. She gnawed on our TV stand, table legs, even the rocks in my grandma's backyard!

One day, Jessie ate something that caused quite a bit of turmoil in the Wilson household. When my mom left the room, Jessie stood on the edge of the bed so she could reach the dresser, leaned over, snatched up my mom's engagement ring, and swallowed. Down it went!

My mom freaked out. Inside the belly of my puppy was her ring. As the old saying goes, what goes in, must come out.

Every day, my dad took Jessie for a walk. He would take a bag with him, scoop up her "business" and take it back home with him. He would then rifle through it, searching for the ring. This went on for days. Then one day, like a prospector sifting through dirt, he struck gold.

Although a little corroded from stomach acid, the ring had made it through its journey unscathed.

Indeed, sifting through dog poop truly epitomizes the suffering component of marriage. Nothing tests a couple's commitment like rifling puppy poopie.

Each time you wear your class ring-just like my mom slips on her engagement ring-let them serve as a reminder of the good times and the bad. Let them serve as a reminder that you have been through some suffering, and there's going to be more to come. In fact, there's going to be plenty of poop to get through in life, but don't worry, you'll get through it. Just ask my dad.
