

Dear Parents and Caregivers,

As the school year comes to an end, The Program for the Development of Human Potential, (PDHP), would like to share some support and resources. This may be a good time to begin to re-evaluate technology in our family life. This is especially important as we are coming into the summer months when there is more open time for our children. We are suggesting that we all make some plans in our households and amongst all caregivers involved in our children's lives. We can bring in the family to sit and discuss these shifts, by doing so, we are modeling decision-making and leadership and indicating to the children that their input and understanding matters greatly. This will often help create more buy-in.

Here are some ideas to consider:

- Structure: Consider time limits for screen use, it is extremely easy to get caught up and lose track of time and content. Maybe confine the use of devices to the more public areas of the home and keep them out of the bedrooms and bathrooms. Set a digital curfew that is age-appropriate for each member. Supervise content by checking in during screen times and asking about different apps, games, shows, etc. that your kids are using and watching. Ask them to show you. Set up devices safely and appropriately when it comes to security and age-appropriate use.
- Resources: This is definitely a daunting task when trying to gauge what is trending or what is age-appropriate. I recommend a few resources to assist parents/caregivers in the most user-friendly way: Common Sense Media, Cool Mom Tech, and Smart Social. Most include language support as well.
- Alternatives: Reflect on and plan some meaningful, screen-free moments you can utilize to reengage the time with your children outside of tech. Board and outdoor games played together, family art projects, planting, time out in nature, just taking a walk, and reading together are simple activities to utilize. Family time that allows for everyone to stop and enjoy their books, Legos, cooking together, or whatever you want to try that brings everyone away from a screen is more meaningful than realized. Ask how the family members liked it or what they didn't like. Ask what they would like to do next time. These may seem unassuming to you, but to the kids, it is time spent with their loved ones. This becomes bonding, and years from now, it is the cherished memory ingrained in our senses something TikTok can never give our kids.
